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The Pre-Associate examination is designed for candidates who wish to assist their teacher in dance classes. The Pre-Associate examination is not a professional teaching qualification and does not entitle the holder to enter candidates for IDTA examinations.

The Pre-Associate examination is one of the pre-requisites for the IDTA Associate teaching examination, available to candidates based outside the UK.

Candidates: Candidates must be 16 years of age and over and if under 21 years of age must

have successfully taken the Intermediate qualification.

Dress: Suitable teaching attire and footwear.

Music: Official IDTA music to be used for set work, supplemented by other appropriate

music where required.

Examination time: 1 candidate 1½ hours

Candidate is required to:

- On the day of the examination provide to the Examiner with a portfolio, including documentation of previous examinations taken, including Intermediate Performer if under 21 years of age and any other relevant information.
- 2. Have a complete knowledge of their 3 chosen grades (one from each section below) including the required variations, dances, amalgamation;
 - a) Preparatory or Primary or Grade 1
 - b) Grade 2 or Grade 3
 - c) Grade 4 or Grade 5

Teachers should advise the examiner in advance of the examination of which grades will be chosen.

- 3. Demonstrate and show an ability to count and instruct rhythmically as requested by the Examiner.
- 4. To discuss observed common faults and corrections.
- 5. Create amalgamations / enchaînements in their chosen grades.
- 6. Discuss the requirements for Dance Awards (formerly medal tests) up to and including Gold.
- 7. Choreograph and present 1 Dance Award (formerly medal test) dance, to their own choice of music for either Bronze, Silver or Gold.
- 8. Demonstrate efficiency in personally editing, organising and operating recorded music.

NOTE: The revised Pre-Associate examination is an option for candidates outside the UK from f^t January 2020. Theatre Branch candidates in the UK must follow the new IDTA Level 3 Diploma Dance Teaching Assistant syllabus, the revised Pre-Associate examination will not be available to UK based candidates.

Ballroom, Latin, Classical Sequence and Freestyle candidates in the UK or outside the UK may take either the current Pre-Associate examination or the new Level 3 Diploma Dance Teaching Assistant.

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
